A MESSAGE FROM OUR VP OF DEI

Creating inclusive workplaces requires that staff members be cognizant of invisible and unconscious hurtful diversity dynamics that occur in workspaces. These include microaggressions, implicit biases, privilege, power, and other actions that send messages to people that they are not included. From another perspective, it is also important to understand that every individual has the power to create positive work environments. Practicing micro-affirmations, which are small gestures, comments, and behaviors that send messages to co-workers that they are valued members of the team, can lead to uplifting and inclusive workplaces. Examples of microaffirmations include saying good-morning, offering to help, recognizing someone for their skills and talents, invitation to lunch, verbal support, and other gestures that welcome people into the work environment. Recognizing diverse community members and the talents and gifts that they bring to the workplace is also an example of micro-affirmations.
