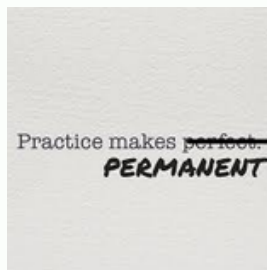
Tips to Lead a Team
