Year One	Understanding Yourself/ Building your Portfolio	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure that your coursework and academic success is your top priority • Reach out to faculty, phase directors, support advisors and tutors if struggling with content • Utilize University resources • Set up your Careers in Medicine (CiM) website account • Complete all career assessments found on the CiM website by the end of Spring Semester • Discuss your self-assessments results and specialty information gathered with your Career Advisor • Attend professional development activities (workshops, speaker series, panel discussion, networking events, etc.) • Create your Portfolio and include your updated Curriculum Vitae (CV)-- Seek out experiences to fill gaps • Join specialty Clubs, Interest groups and Organizations • Obtain meaningful leadership experience (Peer Mentor, Tutor RVU Ambassador, Club Leader, Student Government, etc.) • Participate in enrichment tracks and electives (must be in good academic standing) • Utilize your breaks and summer to participate in career-building activities (networking, informational interviewing, research, military trainings, volunteer service, international travel medical trips, related work experience, etc.) • Explore summer enrichment programs at ExplorehealthCareers.org and Services.aamc.org/summerprograms/ • Utilize the latest publication of "The Successful Match" book to better understand specialty areas • Explore Program Director Survey by specialty of interests
Year Two	Exploring Options/ Enhancing your portfolio	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue your focus on coursework, reach out for assistance when needed, utilize University resources • Integrate Board prep materials with coursework utilizing board prep subscriptions and other resources • Attend professional development sessions • Explore 4-6 specialties of interest through Careers in Medicine website and other resources • Narrow your specialty search to 2-3 specialties of interest • Take USMLE Step 1 and COMLEX Level 1 (must pass) by July 1 • Update your Portfolio to include relevant information from Year 2 • Attend the Fundamentals of Clinical Medicine Training in May to obtain pertinent information for Year 3
